HDFC Self-Determination, Preservation, and Affordability Act (S.880/A.2707)

A Critical Bill to Preserve Affordable Homeownership in NYC – sponsored by Senators **Robert Jackson** and **Cordell Cleare** and Assemblymember **Al Taylor**

THE ISSUE: A Crisis for Affordable Housing and 100,000 New Yorkers

- Housing Development Fund Corporation (HDFC) co-ops provide affordable homeownership to over 100,000 New Yorkers throughout Manhattan, Brooklyn, The Bronx and Queens.
- HDFC coops were created when New York City sold its "in rem" buildings to their tenants, thereby extending first-time homeownership opportunities to traditionally underserved communities and stabilizing neighborhoods.
- Since 1989 most HDFCs have received a partial property tax exemption to keep them affordable for their residents —but this exemption expires in 2029.
- If no replacement tax benefit is enacted, HDFCs will face a **massive tax burden**, leading to:
 - Loss of affordability, forcing longtime low- and moderate-income homeowners to sell.
 - o Financial distress, risking foreclosure or conversion to market-rate housing.
 - Loss of lines of credit & mortgages as banks are already refusing to lend to HDFCs and prospective homeowners due to uncertainty about the financial future of HDFCs.

THE SOLUTION: S.880/A.2707 Preserves Affordability and Ensures Housing Stability

- Continues a tax benefit for HDFCs, ensuring financial viability.
- Maintains income restrictions on new buyers to preserve affordability.
- Respects HDFC homeowners' rights while ensuring affordability compliance.
- Offers certainty—prevents impending affordable housing bankruptcies for 100,000+ New Yorkers
